[Mahayana, Greater Vehicle]

Fundamental Vehicle [Hinayana, Lesser Vehicle]

- Vaibashika = Great Exposition School
- Sauntrantika = Sutra School

Universal Vehicle [Mahayana, Greater Vehicle]

- Cittamatra = Mind Only School
- Madhyamika = Middle Way School

Fundamental Vehicle [Hinayana, Lesser Vehicle]

- Vaibashika = Great Exposition School [18 sub-schools]
- Sautrantika = Sutra School
 - Following Scripture
 - Following Reason

Universal Vehicle [Mahayana, Greater Vehicle]

- Cittamatra = Mind Only School
 - Following Scripture
 - Following Reason
- Madhyamika = Middle Way School
 - Svatantrika [Middle Way Autonomy School]
 - Sautrantika- Svatantrika- Madhyamika
 - Yogacara-Svatantrika-Madhyamika
 - Prasangika [Middle Way Consequence School]

Two Bodies of a Buddha

Accumulation of wisdom → Truth Body - Dharmakaya [for one's own benefit

Accumulation of merit → Form body – Nirmanakaya [for the benefit of others]

Four Bodies of a Buddha

Truth Body - Dharmakaya

- 1. Wisdom truth body jñānadharma-kāya
- 2. Nature or Essence body svabhāvikakāya

Form body - Nirmanakaya

- 1. Enjoyment body sambhogakaya
- 2. Emanation body nirmanakaya
 - a. Supreme emanation body
 - b. Artisan emanation body
 - c. Things like bridges, etc.

Divisions of consciousness

Seven Types of Awareness

- 1. Wrong consciousness
- 2. Doubt [away from, equal, inclined towards]
- 3. Inattentive awareness
- 4. Correct Assumption
- 5. Inferential cognizers
